

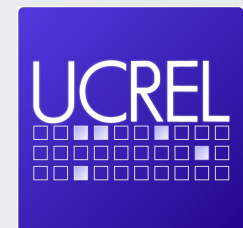
# What can you do with the CLARIN research infrastructure?

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# What is this workshop about?

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- Focus on practical issues for how corpus linguists can benefit from the well-developed ‘Common Language Resources and Technology Infrastructure’ (CLARIN) for language as social and cultural data
- Overview of CLARIN infrastructure including language resources, knowledge infrastructure, participating consortia, resource families
- Aims:
  - Participants will learn how to access and search the existing corpora and tools in the CLARIN research infrastructure and how to embed or deposit their own resources and tools in one of the centres of the infrastructure (with reference to annotation, formats and standards, metadata, licencing and documentation).
